MATERIALS:

1/3 yard Blossom
3/8 yard Bouquet Small
3/4 yard Clouds for Binding
3/8 yard Cotton
1/2 yard Hydrangea
5/8 yard Magnolia
1-1/4 yards Texture Dk Blue
5/8 yard Texture Lt Blue
1/4 yard Blender Goldenrod
1/2 yard Blender Green Meadow
1 yard Blender Magenta
1-1/4 yard Blender White Sand
2-1/2 yards Border
6 1/2 yards for Backing

RECOMMENDED TOOLS:

Wing Clipper 1 by Studio 180 Design
Tucker Trimmer III by Studio 180 Design

*BEFORE SEWING, READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS.
ALL SEAMS ARE 1/4" UNLESS OTHERWISE
STATED. LABEL THE CUTS AS YOU GO. WOF =
WIDTH OF FABRIC; LOF = LENGTH OF
FABRIC; RST = RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER; HST =
HALF SQUARE TRIANGLE*

CUTTING:

From Blossom Fabric:

Cut [5] — 2" × WOF strips

From Bouquet Small Fabric:

Cut [2] — 5-1/2" × WOF strips
Subcut [8] — 5-1/2" squares

From Clouds Fabric:

Cut [9] — 2-1/2" × WOF strips, Binding

From Cotton Fabric:

Cut [2] — 5-1/2" × WOF strips
Subcut [8] — 5-1/2" squares

From Hydrangea Fabric:

Cut [7] — 2" × WOF strips

From Magnolia Fabric:

Cut [9] — 2" × WOF strips

From Texture Dk Blue Fabric:

Cut [4] — 3-3/4" × WOF strips
Subcut [32] — 3-3/4" squares
Cut [12] — 2" × WOF strips

From Texture Lt Blue Fabric:

Cut [7] — 2-1/2" × WOF strips, Inner Border

From Blender Goldenrod Fabric:

Cut [2] — 3" × WOF strips
Subcut [20] — 3" squares

From Blender Green Meadow Fabric:

Cut [7] — 2" × WOF strips

From Blender Magenta Fabric:

Cut [4] — 3-3/4" × WOF strips
Subcut [32] — 3-3/4" squares
Cut [9] — 2" × WOF strips

From Blender White Sand Fabric:

Cut [4] — 6-3/4" × WOF strips
Subcut [16] — 6-3/4" squares
Cut [5] — 3" × WOF strips
Subcut [64] — 3" squares

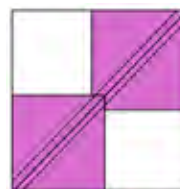
From Border Fabric:

Cut [4] — 10" × LOF strips, Outer Border

BLOCK ASSEMBLY:

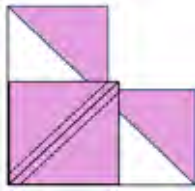
Star Block 1

1. **Flying Geese units.** On the wrong side of [4] Blender Magenta 3-3/4" squares, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner.
2. Place [2] Blender Magenta 3-3/4" squares in opposite corners of a 6-3/4" Blender White Sand square.
3. Stitch 1/4" away from each side of the drawn lines.



4. Cut on the drawn line.
5. Press toward the Blender Magenta triangles.

6. Place another Blender Magenta 3-3/4" square in the corner of the unit.
7. Stitch 1/4" away from each side of the drawn line.



8. Cut on the drawn line.
9. Press toward the Blender Magenta triangle.
10. Repeat Steps 6-9 with the other unit. This will make [4] Flying Geese units.

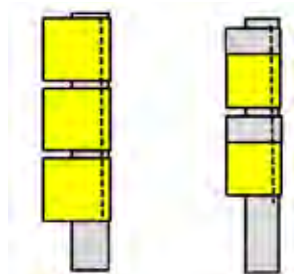


Figure 3A Figure 3B

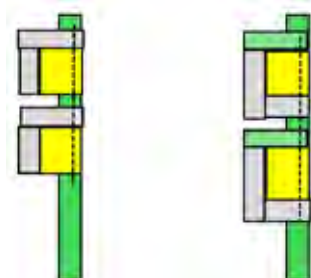
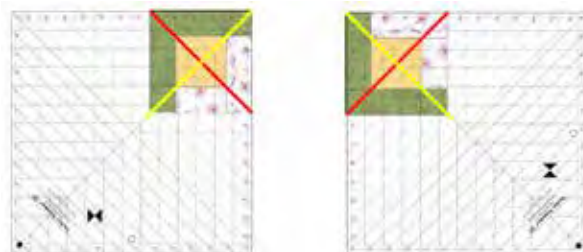


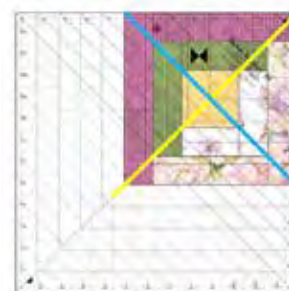
Figure 4A Figure 4B

11. Trim. Using the Wing Clipper I, trim the units to 3" x 5-1/2" (2-1/2" x 5" finished). Place the Flying Geese unit pointing toward you. Place the Wing Clipper 1 on the unit. Line up the guidelines (Blue lines in Figures 3 & 4) on the Wing Clipper I with the seam line of the Flying Geese unit. Trim the right side and top of the unit. See Figure 1A. If you are left handed, place the Flying Geese unit pointing to the right. Line up the guidelines on the Wing Clipper 1 on the seam line of the Flying Geese unit. Trim the left side and top of the unit. See Figure 1B.

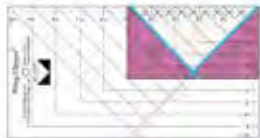

(Left Handed)

12. Rotate the Flying Geese unit 180 degrees. The X on the Wing Clipper 1 (shown as a Red X) will line up with the point of the unit. Trim the other two sides of the unit.

13. Make [32] Flying Geese units with Blender Magenta and Blender White Sand fabrics.
14. Arrange [4] — 3" x 5-1/2" Flying Geese units, [4] Blender White Sand 3" squares, and [1] Bouquet Small 5-1/2" square as shown. Sew units together. Measures 10-1/2" square. Make [8] Star Block 1.



Star Block 2

1. Repeat Star Block 1 Steps 1-14 to make Star Block 2.
2. Use [4] Textured Dk Blue 3-3/4" squares and [1] Blender White Sand 6-3/4" squares to make the sets of [4] Flying Geese units. Make [32] Flying Geese units.
3. Arrange [4] — 3" x 5-1/2" Flying Geese units, [4] Blender White Sand 3" squares, and [1] Cotton 5-1/2" square to make each Star Block 2. Sew the units together. Measures 10-1/2" square. Make [8] Star Block 2.



Log Cabin Block

1. Sew a Blender Goldenrod 3" square to a Blossom 2" x WOF strip. Leave about 1/8" space in between and sew another Blender Goldenrod 3" square to the Blossom strip. See Figure 3A.
2. Continue adding Blender Goldenrod 3" squares to the Blossom strip until [20] of the Blender Goldenrod squares are sewn to the Blossom strip, adding additional Blossom 2" x WOF strips as needed. Press toward the Blossom strip.
3. Trim the Blossom strip even with the Blender Goldenrod 3" squares.

4. Sew the Blender Goldenrod square with the Blossoms strip unit to another Blossom 2" × WOF strip. Place the unit so the last strip added goes under the needle first. See Figure 3B.
5. Continue adding units to the Blossom 2" × WOF strip until you have sewn [20] units to a Blossom strip, adding additional 2" × WOF Blossom strips as needed. Press toward the Blossom strip.

6. Trim the Blossom strip even with the units.
7. Sew the Blender Goldenrod square with the Blossom strip units to a 2" × WOF Blender Green Meadow strip. Place the unit so the last strip added goes under the needle first.
8. Continue adding units to the Blender Green Meadow strip until the [20] units have been sewn to a Blender Green Meadow strip, adding additional 2" × WOF Blender Green Meadow strips as needed.
9. Press toward the Blender Green Meadow strip. Trim the Blender Green Meadow strip even with the units.
10. Sew the units to another 2" × WOF Blender Green Meadow strip, adding additional 2" × WOF Blender Green Meadow strips as needed. Place the unit so the last strip added goes under the needle first.
11. Press toward the Blender Green Meadow strip. Trim the Blender Green Meadow strip even with the units.

12. Trim to size. Line up the 5-1/2" diagonal sizing line (Red line shown below) and the common diagonal line (Yellow line shown below) of the Tucker Trimmer III on the Blender Goldenrod center square. The lines should go from corner to corner in the Blender Goldenrod center square. Trim the right side and top of the unit. Rotate the unit 180 degrees and line up the 5-1/2" diagonal sizing line and the common diagonal line of the Tucker Trimmer III on the Blender Goldenrod center square. Also align the 5-1/2" vertical and horizontal guidelines (Dashed lines on the Tucker Trimmer III) at the edges that were previously trimmed. Trim the right side and top of the unit. If you are left handed, point the Tucker Trimmer III to the left and trim the left side and top each time you trim.

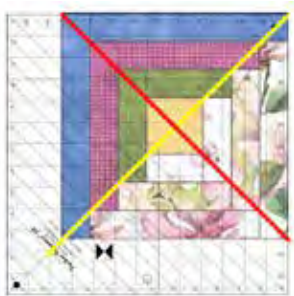


Left Handed

13. Repeat steps 1-6 using 2" × WOF Hydrangea strips. Always place the unit so the last strip added goes under the needle first.
14. Repeat Steps 7-11 using 2" × WOF Blender Magenta strips.
15. Repeat Step 12 to trim to 8". The 8" diagonal sizing line is the blue line (shown below) and the common diagonal line is the yellow line. Also align the 8" vertical and horizontal guidelines (Solid lines on the Tucker Trimmer III) at the edges that were previously trimmed. Trim the right side and top of the unit. If you are left handed, point the Tucker Trimmer III to the left and trim the left side and top each time you trim.

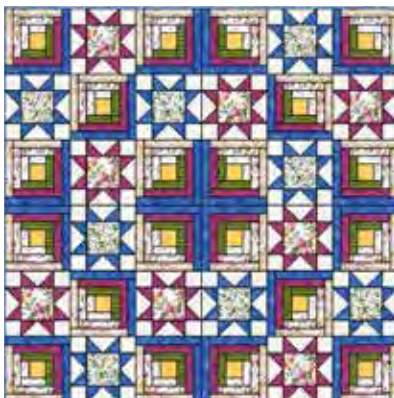


16. Repeat Steps 1-6 using 2" × WOF Magnolia strips. Always place the unit so the last strip added goes under the needle first.
17. Repeat Steps 7-11 using 2" × WOF Textured Dk Blue strips.
18. Repeat Step 12, trimming to 10-1/2". The 10-1/2" diagonal sizing line is the purple line shown below and the common diagonal line is the Yellow line. Also align the 10-1/2" vertical and horizontal guidelines (Dashed lines on the Tucker Trimmer III) at the edges that were previously trimmed. Trim the right side and top of the unit. If you are left handed, point the Tucker Trimmer III to the left and trim the left side and top each time you trim. Make [20] Log Cabin Blocks.



QUILT TOP ASSEMBLY:

1. Arrange blocks according to the Quilt Top Diagram. Notice how the Log Cabin Blocks are arranged and the placement of the Star Block 1 and Star Block 2.
2. Sew the blocks together into rows. Press the seams of every other row to one side and the other rows to the other side. This allows your seam to "nest" together when sewing the rows together.
3. Sew the rows together. Press seams in one direction.



BORDER ASSEMBLY:

Inner Border

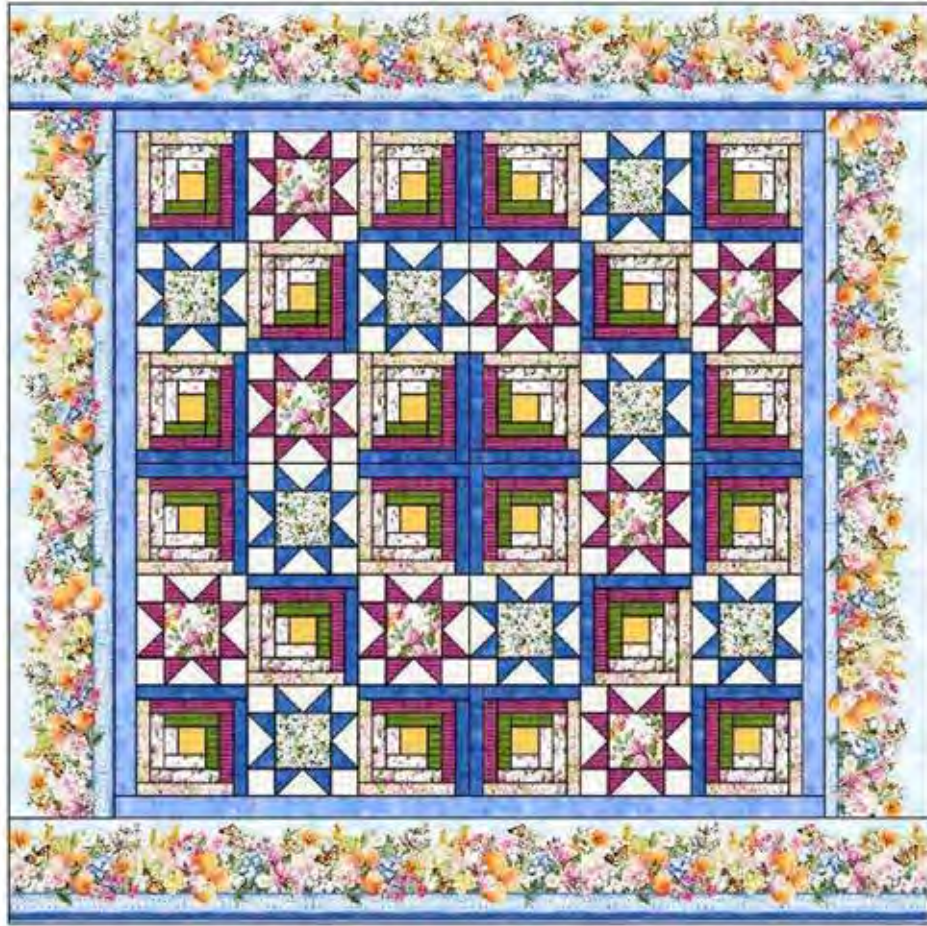
1. Sew the [7] — 2-1/2" × WOF Texture Lt Blue strips together end to end. Press seams to one side.
2. The quilt center should be 60-1/2" square. Measure the center of the quilt from top to bottom and cut [2] of the 2-1/2" Inner Border strips to that measurement. Sew the [2] strips to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the Inner Border.
3. Measure the center of the quilt from side to side with the [2] Inner Borders. It should measure 64-1/2". Cut [2] - 2-1/2" Inner Border strips to the size of the quilt. Sew the [2] strips to the top and bottom of the quilt center. Press toward the Inner Border.

Outer Border

1. Measure the quilt from top to bottom. It should measure 64-1/2". Cut the 10" Border strips to that measurement.
2. Sew the Outer Borders to the sides of the quilt. Press toward the Outer Border.
3. Measure the quilt from side to side. It should measure 84-1/2". Cut the top and bottom borders to that measurement. Sew the [2] Borders to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward the Outer Border.

FINISHING:

1. Sew the [9] Clouds 2-1/2" × WOF strips cut for binding together end to end. Fold in half with the long edges together and wrong sides together. Press.
2. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing.
3. Quilt as desired.
4. Bind, Label, & Enjoy!
